Programme Overview

The World Natural Democracy Internship Programme 2026–27 is a transformative and interdisciplinary academic initiative aligned with the National Education Policy 2020 and the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, while drawing intellectual inspiration from global frameworks such as UNESCO’s Global Citizenship Education and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. The programme is designed to empower undergraduate and postgraduate students across Arts, Commerce, and Science, including BA, B.Com, B.Sc., MA, M.Com, MSc. and related disciplines. It enables participants to engage with real-world challenges within their own communities while cultivating ethical awareness, ecological sensitivity, and a sense of universal responsibility through the guiding philosophy of Natural Democracy.

Objectives and Vision

The primary objective of the internship is to bridge academic learning with real-world engagement while nurturing ethical awareness, civic responsibility, environmental consciousness, and leadership capacity. It aims to cultivate socially responsible and globally aware, grounded in the philosophy of Natural Democracy critical thinking, interdisciplinary understanding, and community-based problem solving. The programme envisions developing individuals who are not only academically competent but also, which emphasizes harmony between human society and nature.

Learning Vision and NEP Alignment

Rooted in the principles of the National Education Policy 2020, the programme emphasizes experiential learning, multidisciplinary engagement, value-based education, and the integration of knowledge with practice. It promotes constitutional literacy, civic responsibility, and critical thinking, while fostering environmental citizenship, planetary consciousness and sustainable living. The internship reflects NEP’s vision of developing well-rounded individuals who combine academic competence with ethical integrity, social commitment, and global awareness.

Eligibility and Inclusive Participation

The internship is open to all undergraduate and postgraduate students across disciplines and departments, ensuring inclusivity for participants from both rural and urban backgrounds. It adopts a community-embedded model that encourages students to actively engage in meaningful initiatives within their own local contexts. This approach strengthens the connection between





academic learning and societal realities, making education more relevant, participatory, and impactful.

Duration and Academic Flexibility

The total duration of the internship is one hundred and twenty hours, with a recommended daily engagement of four to six hours. The schedule remains flexible and may be undertaken on weekdays, weekends, or holidays, allowing students to integrate the internship with their academic commitments. The structure is academically aligned while avoiding rigid timelines, thereby ensuring adaptability across diverse institutional settings.

Conceptual Lecture Framework

A structured lecture series forms the intellectual foundation of the programme, covering key themes such as constitutional literacy and civic responsibility, Indian knowledge systems and sustainable living, Applied ethics and social inclusion, environmental citizenship and climate action, education and intergenerational responsibility, global citizenship and peacebuilding, local governance and participatory democracy, community health in the context of sustainable development goals, digital ethics and media literacy, and the philosophy and practice of Natural Democracy. These lectures provide a comprehensive framework linking local action with national values and global perspectives.

Core Learning Dimensions

The internship is organized around integrated learning components that include global citizenship and constitutional values in relation to Natural Democracy, environmental sustainability and earth ethics, community engagement and awareness initiatives, research and observational learning alongside digital responsibility, leadership and life skills development, and health, hygiene, and well-being. Together, these dimensions ensure a holistic, interdisciplinary, and practice-oriented learning experience.

Expected Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the programme, participants will develop a deeper understanding of constitutional principles and civic responsibilities, along with a practical awareness of sustainability and environmental ethics. They will be able to apply the values of Natural Democracy in real-life contexts, demonstrating a balance between individual responsibility and collective well-being. In addition, they will strengthen their research and analytical abilities,





enhance digital literacy and ethical judgments, and develop leadership, communication, and problem-solving skills, emerging as informed and responsible citizens.

Assessment and Academic Deliverables

Participants are required to complete a set of structured academic and practical deliverables, including the maintenance of an internship logbook, the submission of a final report of approximately 500 to 1000 words, documented evidence of community engagement or outreach activities, and a presentation or viva, where applicable. These components are designed to evaluate both the process of learning and the impact of engagement.

Natural Democracy and Universal Responsibility

A central focus of the programme is the philosophy of Natural Democracy, which emphasizes harmony between human beings, society, and nature. It promotes ethical and participatory decision-making, ecological balance, sustainability, and the principle of universal responsibility, wherein individuals recognize their role not only as citizens of a nation but also as members of a shared global ecosystem. This vision encourages a shift from individual-centric approaches to collective well-being and planetary consciousness.

Policy Alignment and Relevance

The programme is aligned with key national and international frameworks, including the National Education Policy 2020, the guidelines of the University Grants Commission, UNESCO's Global Citizenship Education, and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals. This alignment ensures that the internship remains academically relevant, socially meaningful, and globally connected.

Timeline and Programme Flow

The registration process is conducted on an open and rolling basis, without a fixed deadline, enabling wider participation across institutions. The detailed internship schedule, along with guidelines and activity frameworks, will be shared with registered participants within three to four days following registration. The internship programme will commence within approximately five to ten days from the date of registration, ensuring a structured yet flexible academic engagement cycle. Participation requires a non-refundable internship fee of six hundred rupees, and registration is confirmed only upon successful payment.





Application Requirements and Code of Conduct

Applicants are required to submit a passport-size photograph in JPG format not exceeding 500 kilobytes (KB), a signature in JPG format not exceeding 200 KB, and a consent letter in PDF format not exceeding 2 megabytes (MB), along with a valid email address and mobile number. Participants are expected to maintain discipline, punctuality, and professionalism throughout the programme. Regular attendance and active participation are mandatory, and all assignments must be submitted within stipulated timelines. Original work is required, and any form of plagiarism is strictly prohibited.

Responsibility, Safety and Communication

Participants are expected to act responsibly and ensure their personal safety during all activities. While the organizing body provides guidance and a structured framework, it shall not be held liable for unforeseen circumstances. Communication, including WhatsApp group details, will be shared shortly after registration by the respective college or university nodal officer. Complete internship information, including schedules and guidelines, will also be available on the official website.

Acceptance Letter and Certification

Upon successful registration, participants will be issued an official Internship Acceptance Letter by World Natural Democracy (WND), which may be used for academic and institutional purposes. Upon satisfactory completion of all internship requirements, participants will be awarded an Internship Completion Certificate by WND. The certificate will formally recognize the participant's engagement, duration of participation, and successful fulfillment of the programme's academic and experiential components, and may be used for academic, professional, or institutional submissions.
